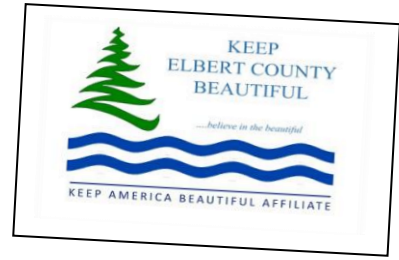


# ELBERT COUNTY RECYCLING & SHREDDING Event

- TVs and computer monitors:** \$3.00 fee for small units; \$5.00 for large units; \$10.00 for projection type TV's.
- Automobile Tires:** \$4.00 fee per tire. Pickup truck tires: \$6.00 each.

**ALL TIRES MUST BE OFF RIMS**

**or you will be charged an extra \$10 per tire.**

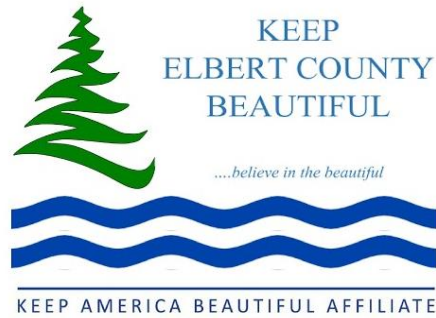
**LIMIT OF 5 TIRES PER VEHICLE**
